What is the Guardianship Division?



The **Guardianship Division of NCAT** is a group of people who make decisions.

It is more relaxed than a court.

What is a guardian?



A guardian is someone who makes some important decisions for you.



The Guardianship Division of NCAT decided you need a guardian to make some decisions for you.



Your guardian might be someone you know well, like a family member or friend.

Your guardian might be the NSW Public Guardian.

What is a guardianship order?



Your **guardianship order** is an important paper.

It is like a set of rules that say:

- When the order ends
- What decisions your guardian can make

You can ask your guardian for a copy of your guardianship order.

If you do not want a guardian you can ask the Guardianship Division **to review your order**.



This means they decide if you still need a guardian.
